Unitary Councillor Dance updated the Parish Council on the latest financial situation at Somerset Council and discussed the budget options. Somerset Council have issued a letter to Parish Councils informing them of asset and service devolution – passing over the financial responsibility of vital services to Parish Councils to pay for. Cllr Dance explained the enormous financial challenge that is facing Somerset Council. The rising cost of social care, together with inflation, plus a failure by government to bring forward the promised Fair Cost of Care policy, have contributed to the emergency. Also, the decision by central government to dramatically reduce funding for local authorities over recent years, plus the decision of the previous administration to freeze council tax for six years in a row, has led to an emergency position. This is now going to have a massive effect on the Parish Councils budget and precept.

Cllr Meecham updated the Parish Council on the defibrillator situation. The Department for Health and Social Care have launched an initiative to help fund public accessible defibrillators The fund will provide 2,000 new public access defibrillators for communities across England - 100 applications will be selected by DHSC to receive a fully funded AED and External Heated Cabinet - 1900 applications will receive partial DHSC funding for an AED and External Heated Cabinet – organisations will be required to provide their own match funding of c. £750. Cllr Meecham has applied on behalf of the Parish Council.

He explained he is also in talks with The Red Cross regarding a scheme they are running. Action: Cllr. Meecham

Draft budget - planning

The Clerk had received a letter only that afternoon from Somerset Council outlining the difficult financial situation they are in and the devolution of assets and services to Parish Councils. This had been circulated to the Parish Councillors before the meeting. The Parish Council will become financially responsible for many services including – dog bin emptying, Grit bins – filled twice a year, Street cleaning – 2-3 times a year, roadside verges – cut twice a year, weed treatment, fly tipping – costs to remove it, drains – jetting, collapsed drain repairs, drain clearance.

The Parish Council need to have funds to pay for this plus have an emergency fund for items that require urgent repairs. The only way the Parish Council will be able to fund these services is by having a significant rise in their precept.

The Parish Council are looking at ways to be able to take the cost of these services on and are all working hard at the budget for 2024-25.
